ARREST ATTEMPTED

James Stephens, 38 years old, brother of Henry Stephens, Jr., cashier of the First National Bank here and ex-circuit court clerk, was shot and instantly killed Wednesday evening at 5 o'clock on spurlock fork of Middle Creek by Magistrate R. L. Stone, of magisterial district No. 2.

Shortly following the slaying, Maggie Stone came to Presqueburg and surrendered to authorities. He was in jail here Thursday as the grand jury was making an investigation of the case.
