Law Enforcement

The Sheriff of your county is the chief law enforcement officer. He holds the most powerful office within the gift of the people. He has the authority to summon every citizen in his county, if he deems it necessary, to assist him in enforcing the law.

When you are deciding for whom you should east your vote for this very important office, you should deeply realize the grave and serious duty you are about to perform. You should look for these three most important qualifications.

It has always been my idea that kindness instead of abuse, justice tempered with mercy will make your son and mine a better citizen in the future.

2. DETERMINATION. The Sheriff and his deputies must enforce the laws of our state and country. Every person in this county will agree we must have iaw enforcement. Our schools, churches and homes must be protected. But you want sober, fair and determined officers to do this job. Only by casting your votes for a man who has done this job, can you be sure you will have this kind of law enforcement.

It was said of me on the first Monday in January, 1950 to a crowded controom in Prestonsburg, Kentucky, "You can say one thing about Sheriff Sturgill, he treated them all alike". My family and myself appreciated this very much, whether it was intended as a compliment or refticism. We knew that it was the truth. I promise the people 4 more years of the same treatment. Faireet the following statement to the God fearing Mothers and Fathers of this county realizing that I shall answer and be held responsible to my Master for this statement, that during my six years of service as Sheriff, I never failed to perform my duties as I saw it and to the best of my ability. My office force and myself assisted in every way possible with my time and money, in every investigation of crime committed during my term of office.

I have never during my life had an indictment returned against me or a warrant issued for me, upon any charge. I have never been arraigned before 12 of my citizens to be tried for any crime. Decide from the truth, facts and records, not from misleading, false, smearing gossip.

I shall discuss this more fully later in the campaign. I want you to know my record and it is your duty to inquire into all candidates records and you, the VOTERS, are entitled to have it.
