Two staffers at Head Start suspended

In-house investigation prompts allegations of misuse of funds, equipment

The director and bookkeeper for Floyd County's Head Start program were suspended Thursday without pay after a state and local investigation into the program's expenses.

Letters notifying them of their suspensions were delivered Thursday by

assistant superintendent Gary Frazier to Head Start director Janie Bailey and bookkeeper Ruth Derossett, who were immediately relieved of their duties with the federally-funded Head Start program.

The suspensions followed a week-long investigation into the program by local school officials, the state's Office of Education Accountability, and officials with the Big Sandy Community Action Program (CAP), which

administers Head Start programs in the Big Sandy region. The probe reportedly was directed at abnormal expenses submitted by and approved for the Floyd County program, including reimbursements for staff travel.

Gary Frazier declined Thursday to discuss specifics of the Head Start probe, referring questions to superintendent Stephen Towler, who was expected to be out of town until Mon-

day. Frazier did confirm, however, that Bailey and Derossett had been suspended by Towler without pay, pending completion of the in-house investigation, which Frazier said could be wrapped up within the next 30 days.

Towler's letters to the two, who are considered to be employees of the Floyd County School System, suggested that Bailey and Derossett have been accused of "misuse of funds,

misuse of Head Start equipment, unauthorized credit practices" and "inappropriate" conduct.

Former assistant superintendent Pete Grigsby, who was responsible for overseeing the Floyd County Head Start program before being transferred to other duties, said Thursday that he had initiated the in-house investigation in May after "a large bill came across my desk concerning a couple of trips made by Head Start person-

nel." Grigsby said questions over the May expenses were "the first irregularities" he had noted during his tenure as supervisor for the program. Grigsby said he did not know the outcome of the investigation because he had been reassigned before it was finished.

"I have not been called in to discuss the investigation with Towler,"

Coal monies to secure jobs at new plant

Floyd County Fiscal Court members voted at a special meeting Friday to proceed with two economic development projects which are expected to bring about 500 new jobs to the area.

Court members voted unanimously to use \$200,000 of coal severance tax money to help secure a loan for RND Design Inc. to locate a plant at Warco in the old United Supply Building.

Economic Development Executive Director Darrell Gilliam told the court that securing the loan for RND Design was the "last major step" by the court.

Gilliam said that company representatives

"He made threats that if things didn't go the way they were supposed to at the hearing, he would be very unhappy," Newsome said.

Hall's attorney, Tim Parker, filed a motion to reduce Hall's bond. Parker's motion said that Hall denies threatening anyone. A hearing on that motion was set for Friday at 1 p.m.

A preliminary hearing has been set for Wednesday, August 4 at 3 p.m.

Investigation begins into death of biker

An investigation is expected to begin today, Friday, into a motorcycle accident Tuesday which fatally injured a Floyd County man.

Daniel (Danny) Hunt, 30, died Wednesday from injuries received in the Tuesday night accident which reportedly happened near Corn Fork in Prestonsburg.

Kentucky State Police sergeant Tony Cambron said Thursday that

the accident apparently had not been reported to police when it happened.

"We had no knowledge of the accident," Cambron said. "It will be investigated by the state police. A detective will start the investigation Friday."

Hunt died at Cabell Huntington Hospital in Huntington, West Virginia.

Funeral services will be Sunday at 11 a.m. at Nelson Frazier Funeral Home.

DUI suspect jailed after two injured in accident

A Floyd County man was jailed Tuesday following an apparent alcohol-related automobile accident in downtown Prestonsburg that sent two women to the hospital.

Officer Anthony Castle of the Prestonsburg Police Department said Wednesday that the accident occurred when Paul True Albert, 46, of Prestonsburg, allegedly failed to stop at a red light at the intersection of U.S. 23 and North Lake Drive, struck a vehicle driven by Deborah K. Tackett, 34, of Beaver, and drove over a steep embankment abutting the intersection.

Tests show that Albert had a blood-alcohol content of .139, which is above the legal .10 limit, Castle said. He added that Albert also allegedly attempted to set fire to a police cruiser's interior after he was arrested. Tackett and a passenger, 56-year-

old Eva Vance, also of Beaver, were transported to Highlands Regional Medical Center. Two children, also passengers in the Tackett vehicle, were unharmed.

Albert remains lodged in the Floyd County Jail on two counts of second degree assault; four counts of wanton endangerment; reckless driving; no insurance; disregarding a traffic signal; failure to register the transfer of a vehicle; and driving under the influence of intoxicating beverages, second offense.

Although a \$70,000 bond was set for Albert at an arraignment hearing, Castle said Thursday, legal authorities have issued a parole detainer requesting that Albert remain in custody for violating the terms of a five-year probation for crimes in Florida. Albert will appear in Floyd District Court on Wednesday, August 4 at 3:30 p.m. for a preliminary hearing on the charges levied against him Wednesday.

Three vie for office of mayor

Interest remains light in most local races just days before the filing deadline for the November general election.

The most crowded races as of Friday are for the mayors of Prestonsburg and Wheelwright. Tuesday, August 3 is the last day to file for city commission and council races and for two seats on the Floyd County Board of Education.

Three people have filed to run for the Mayor of Wheelwright, including one city commissioner, Lowell D. Parker, who has been an outgoing member of the commission, filed this week for mayor along with David Marlee Sammons and W.R. Booche Hall.

Candidates for mayor of Prestonsburg are three current city councilmen, George P. Archer, Jerry Finner and Mike Vance.

Two people have filed to run for school board member in Educational District Two.

Newly-appointed board member Bob Isaac is seeking to keep his seat on the board after being appointed earlier this year by Education Commissioner Thomas Boyesen.

Also filing for the District Two board seat is former school superintendent Ray Brackett. Brackett served as superintendent for four years.

No one had filed as of Friday for the board seat in Educational District Three. Also, there were no filings for city commission seats for the cities of Allen and Martin.

No petition to move the county seat out of Prestonsburg was filed as of Friday.

Duty called again for ten area veterans last week when families along the Mississippi River began their battle with the swollen river.

The veterans, most of whom are disabled by injuries received in service to their country, fought the weather, rising water and lack of sleep to help build levees in St. Charles and St. Genevieve, Missouri.

Tucker Howard, Steve Martin, Don Hancey, Bill Scurluck, Roger Stambaugh, Howard Jones, Roger Williams, Ron Marshall, Frank Wozniowski and Jimmy Fairchild transported supplies to the area in a five-vehicle caravan.

The three-ton care package of food, water and cleaning supplies was collected by the Veterans Refer-

ral Center in Paintsville and was donated by area merchants and individuals.

The veterans spent most of Tuesday and Tuesday night collecting and loading the supplies, getting about three hours sleep before leaving on Wednesday.

They arrived at their destination, St. Louis, Thursday. They were stunned at the total devastation.

"I've never seen anything like it," said Tucker Howard, who had visited the St. Louis area before the disaster.

"You would see the big arch of St. Louis, and there were streets below it," he said. "Now, below the arch, the street lights (globes) sticking out of water were all you could see."

"Forty feet of water covered Main Street," explained Don Haney. "The town had 8,000 homes and 3,000 of them were under water."

"I felt a sense of pulling together," Howard explained. "Hundreds and hundreds of teenagers filled bags. The older ladies who couldn't do the work prepared food."

"It boosted my opinion of humanity," said Howard, a Vietnam Veteran.

The veterans worked side by side with people from New York, California and Alaska — people who were there for the sole purpose of filling sandbags. The work was physically and emotionally exhausting. One Red Cross worker told them he had been at it (filling sandbags) for 28 days.

Exhausted and with health problems that needed attention — one of the veterans had left his chemotherapy medication behind — they headed home.

Two members of the group, Roger Stambaugh and Howard Jones, stayed on and continued the fight.

"We wanted to stay and help," said Howard. "The people need so much help."

"People here don't know how fortunate we are with the protection of the dams," Haney said. "The destruction there was unreal."

Are we turning garbage into gold?

Letcher County Judge Ruben Watts added a dash of perspective to the pot of troubles brewing over the disposal of solid waste in Eastern Kentucky when he noted that garbage had more value than coal.

When you consider that it costs about \$42 a ton to haul trash to the landfills and that coal is selling for about \$20 a ton, it's easy to get the point.

Of course the big difference in the comparison is that trash is not a resource, it's a liability.

Our region benefits financially from mining and selling coal but is strained financially by the costs of having our garbage hauled away.

It's a sure bet, though, that somebody is making plenty of money on what we throw away and they are likely to for some time.

Garbage, unlike coal, is a renewable commodity, if you can call it that. Everybody creates it and nobody wants it. That means

that the few who are willing to take it can name their own price. It's not inconceivable, then, that garbage could soon be worth its weight in gold.

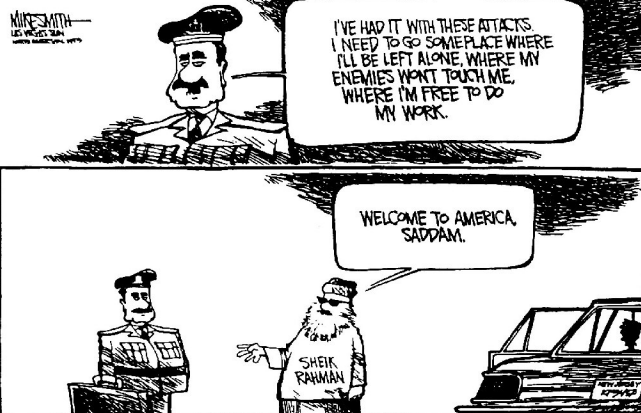
That's not an encouraging thought for those of us who'll have to pick up the tab.

It should encourage us, though, to consider a change of attitude concerning the disposal of solid waste.

The prevailing Not-In-My-Backyard stance against developing disposal sites will last only as long as somebody else's backyard is available at prices we can afford. Sooner or later we're going to have to take care of our own.

A country that can successfully land a man on the moon ought to be able to develop an environmentally safe and economical means of taking out its trash.

If we don't put our heads together soon to discover that system, the price of a moonshot may be what it will take to get rid of the stuff.

Teen trouble

America's future rests with its young people. A cliché—and from the perspective of a searching new study by the National Research Council, an alarming prospect. The study, echoing the findings of many social scientists and others in recent years, found the principal institutions serving adolescents—schools, health services, the justice system and families—are failing at their task. Not only do they fail in providing teenagers with effective guidance, the study concludes, but their deterioration can actually make matters worse for youths.

The study found that many adolescent problems have worsened in part because of the strained environments in which many young people grow up. This finding reinforces the need to pursue the many efforts already underway to strengthen family ties, bring new vitality to school classrooms and steer young people away from drugs and crime.

What is striking about this study, sponsored by the research arm of the National Academy of Sciences, is its emphasis on institutional shortcomings. True, indi-

viduals—even teenagers—are responsible for their actions. But at their vulnerable age, and buffeted by social forces over which they have little control, they need nurturing, guidance and watchful care. In short, they need help from the very entities, from schools to courts to families, that so often appear to let them down.

How can these findings be put to constructive use? We would like to see the NRC's discussion at the grassroots level—at PTA meetings, school boards, youth clubs, settlement houses, juvenile courts and other agencies.

A highly respected team of researchers has found those institutions overwhelmed. What is their response? A coordinated dialogue, following up the NRC's study with replies from the front, as it were, would offer a real prospect of remedial steps that could make a difference.

Time's a'wasting

Bruce Babbitt, who as Interior secretary presides over the U.S. Office of Surface Mining, offered some reassuring words this week to the agency's employees, coal field citizens, environmentalists and even coal mine operators.

The agency created to administer the federal surface mining reclamation law is, he contended, a "mess" and in need of attention. That's hardly surprising, given the

fact that for 12 of its 16 years, it was run by Republicans who often regarded environmental regulation as a costly nuisance. As the Bush era ground to an end, OSM director Harry Snyder was accused of undercutting OSM's own inspectors and of ignoring citizen concerns.

Mr. Babbitt promised to make the agency "what it ought to be" and said the administration will appoint a new director soon.

That's fine, but where's the beef? Names of possible appointees have been handed about since December. Clinton spokesmen said in January that a successor to Mr. Snyder would be picked within a month. The transition to a new way of doing things at OSM is overdue.

Mr. Babbitt has had his hands full. But overseeing the surface mining law is one of his department's major duties, and the way he handles it is of profound importance to coal states. The prompt selection of a director who shares his goals would be the best sign that he's serious about doing the job right.

I tend to agree but would like to give what I feel may be some of the solutions to solving some of the problems with youth in the society of today. I am often asked to give an opinion since I have been the Director at the Sheriff's Youth Camp for many years and have worked with numerous children. I have raised five children of my own and am the proud grandfather of ten. I believe this qualifies me to know about various problems facing young people and their parents today.

We must remember that today's children, starting with age ten, are much more worldly and are "grown up" in many ways. Television has made them more aware of what is going on around them while destroying many moral values. They witness profanity, vulgarity and sexuality as an everyday way of life. Unfortunately, children are learning many of the wrong ways which are not conducive to a good way of life. Yes, they are much more learned than we were at their age, but what they are learning from us is in many ways, a real detriment to a good moral lifestyle.

Youngsters are crying out for discipline! We need to give them firm discipline, be decisive and not back off when pressed by them or our peers. There are many ways to discipline a child without being abusive. Show that you love them and sincerely follow through with your love to each child with your actions and words. Don't play favorites with double standards for different children.

Children need both male and female influence in their homes. Many families have only one parent raising children, but when one has the sole responsibility, an attempt should be made to have an opposite visit the home as frequently as possible. A child needs both male and female role models, as much as is possible to show by example how to lead a good life.

Please show affection toward the child! Youngsters are starving for affection of some type because they are, in many cases, shoved aside and there is no closeness when the need is so "ficial. They need a good hug on a day. "sis. Just showing you care about them works wonders. This could be one of the most important roles an adult can play in a child's life.

Teach them that faith in God gives meaning and purpose to human life! Far too many children are taking their own lives by suicide. Work hard to give their life meaning and purpose by telling them that God loves them and they are not alone in their life. A good church lifestyle should be encouraged by getting your child involved in a church of your choosing. All churches are good. Just select one and take them to it.

Your lifestyle may require you to work more than you would like. This may prevent you from spending as much time with your children as you like. Please, do not try to compensate by catering to them or showering them with unneeded gifts just to ease your guilt feelings. Simply do not try to make up your lost time by gestures of trying to buy their love and acceptance. They are not dumb and they will try both ends against the middle.

This is a terrible way to try to make up to your child. Be honest with yourself and your child. Over compensation will only make the situation worse. You can give them plenty of love. This is something that can't be bought. Work to prevent bad attitudes. This is a real problem of today. With bad news on a daily basis from television programming, pornography running rampant and news coverage of gangs and killings in all cities, it is no wonder that negative attitudes need to be changed into positive ones. We can strive to develop good attitudes and teach children to learn how to respect and be respected in return. Practice these qualities in your home and your child will more than likely possess these attributes.

Parents can spend more quality time with their children to avert a crisis that may loom on the horizon. Get to know them better so that your own pleasures may be molded to coincide with theirs. Be more tolerant with your child and try to understand their needs and wants.

Children are the heartbeat of our nation and we must set the example. Many of these suggestions can be implemented. Are we up to the task???

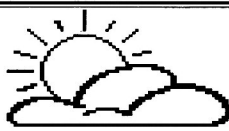

State to decide fate of ex-Magoffin schools chief

The State Board for Elementary and Secondary Education has scheduled an August 14 hearing on whether to prevent former Magoffin County schools superintendent Carter Whitaker from teaching.

Following through on a threat to reinstate 19 misconduct charges against Whitaker if the former schools chief took a teaching position. Those are the same charges that caused Whitaker to resign last month, rather than face removal.

Kevin Nolan, general counsel for the Department of Education said the hearing, scheduled two days before Magoffin County teachers are to report for in-service training, will be to decide whether to suspend Whitaker.

Despite the threat of state charges from Boysen, Interim Superintendent Arnie Oaken earlier this month assigned Whitaker as a math teacher at the Herald Whitaker Middle School, named for Whitaker's father and predecessor. — Lexington Herald-Leader

Letcher County man held in Collins burglary

A 24-year-old Letcher County man remained in jail this week on charges of burglarizing the home of former Letcher Circuit Judge Larry D. Collins.

Coley Brown, of Haymond, was arrested by a deputy sheriff July 14 after Collins, who lives near Blackey, obtained an arrest warrant charging Brown with stealing a gun and some checks from Collins' home on June 22 and 23.

In his complaint, Collins says that Brown "entered and remained in affiant's home while

affiant was out of town...and while there stole one gun...and also did take checks which (Brown) did forge and cash at First Security Bank for \$200 each."

Brown was still being held in the county jail this week under \$10,000 cash bond on each burglary charge. — The Mountain Eagle, Whitesburg

Three escape in Magoffin

Officials were searching for three men who escaped Wednesday while being taken to the Big Sandy Regional Detention Center.

Magoffin Sheriff Chalmers Wireman said the three ran away from Jailer John Clay Watkins on the way out of arraignment proceedings in Magoffin District Court. The jailer had removed their handcuffs after the proceedings.

The three were identified as Tony Manns, 24, held on a drug trafficking charge; Benjie Manns, 18, already charged with third degree escape, contempt of court and fourth degree assault; and Gordon Davis, 20, with charges ranging from marijuana possession and burglary to operating a vehicle on a suspended license. All three are from Salyersville. — Lexington Herald-Leader

A one million dollar lawsuit has been filed against Martin County Superintendent Bill Stone. Prestonsburg attorney Ned Pillerdorf filed the suit on behalf of former Tomahawk Elementary principal Donald Fannin of July 9.

The complaint was filed in Pikeville's Federal Court and names the Martin County Board of Education as well. It alleges that Fannin's civil rights were violated when he was demoted after exposing alleged theft at the school.

The suit alleges that "the defendant Stone recognizing that his political allies were angered at the Plaintiff's actions and outspokenness, vindictively retaliated by demoting the Plaintiff to a teaching position at a lesser rate of pay."

Jeff Marsh with the firm of Boel, Stophor, and Graves in Prestonsburg has been assigned the job of defending Stone. — The Martin County Sun

Cookie strike picketer's story may crumble

The first strike-related violence in Eastern Kentucky this summer may have involved cookies instead of coal.

But state police and officials at a Pike County cookie factory suggested that it might not have happened.

James L. Abshire, 58, of Phyllis, the husband of one of the strikers at Mountain Top Bakery at Meta, claims he was struck by a tractor trailer that ran the picket lines on Wednesday.

Abshire was taken to Pikeville Methodist Hospital, where no evidence of injury was found. Police said he was injured by a cookie.

About 65 or 70 pickets at the scene told police they saw the truck strike Abshire, but none would give statements. — Lexington Herald-Leader

Breathitt board loses sex discrimination suit

A federal jury awarded more than \$1 million in damages to a Breathitt County school employee Wednesday after finding she was wrongfully passed up for a principal's job.

The jury found that Maxine Hudson was denied the position at Breathitt County High School because of her sex and her political affiliations. The panel awarded Hudson \$1.05 million for mental anguish and humiliation. She also got \$17,890 in lost wages.

The board members could not be reached for comment. — Louisville Courier-Journal

Floyd County schools: A system in transition

Introduction

This report is completed as a requirement of the Kentucky Department of Education Improvement Plan for Floyd County public schools. It is intended to summarize several facets of the total operation of the district as perceived by the superintendent.

The chief executive for Floyd County schools has completed one year in the district—a year in which activities have been focused on addressing 80 recommendations for improvement in the management of the school district. Even if the KDE did not require this statement, it would be a timely activity to summarize the status of programs in the school system on an annual basis. This report will be the first of many to follow on Floyd County Public Schools.

Floyd County has operated a county system of public schools since the early part of this century. Soon the system will approach 100 years of existence. Over thirty years ago, the independent school system in Prestonsburg became a part of the county system.

During the past decades, dramatic change has occurred in Floyd County Schools as well as all other public systems in Kentucky and America. During the past eight years, Floyd County has had considerable attention focused from the state level on the operation of the district. The prevailing opinion of people both inside and out of Floyd County was one that suggested improvement was needed in many areas. The Kentucky Education Reform Act passed by the General Assembly in 1990 seemed to concentrate its mandate on certain areas—a results oriented curriculum based on outcomes, and a requirement that school districts operate in an effective and efficient manner.

The later goal of changed management expectations has led the state to focus its attention once again on the Floyd County District.

The Office of Education Accountability has spent considerable time in Floyd County investigating a variety of matters that were brought to the agency's attention. The Kentucky Department of Education spent several weeks in Floyd County during the spring of 1992 and conducted an investigation that was very critical of many aspects of the operations of Floyd County. An improvement plan was required to begin in October and be substantially completed by the end of December. The KDE has monitored activities in Floyd County during the past nine months of the past school year, 1992-93.

A new superintendent began work in Floyd County in July, 1993. He followed an interim superintendent who served for three months under the appointment of the Department of Education. The superintendent selection process did not go as planned and the state intervened to disqualify a chosen candidate and work with the board on the final selection.

The new superintendent, Dr. Steve Towler, came to Floyd County as a native Kentuckian from the eastern part of the state. He had served 25 years in education and 15 years as a local superintendent in three different school districts most recently as the chief executive of Hardin County, the fourth largest district in Kentucky. With all of this brief historical perspective, 1992-93 has been a memorable year in Floyd County with a flurry of activity taking place.

Board of Education

Currently, the Floyd Board of Education operates with five members. One member, Eddie Baugh, has served for two and a half years for Division One. Two members, Ed Patton from Division Four and Hattie Owens from Division Five, were elected in November of 1992 and began their four year terms in January, 1993. They have no months experience.

Two additional board members, Bob Isaac from Division Two and Dr. Brent Clark from Division Three were appointed in May 1993, by the Commissioner to replace a deceased member, Ray "Shag" Campbell and another member, Tommy Boyd, who has resigned.

The "new" board of education is truly a young board in terms of service, but each member has taken the oath of office with a sincere attitude to improve the Floyd County schools.

As an example, the regular meetings in February, March and April each lasted approximately 10 hours length. Special board meetings are frequently called by the chairman to conduct urgent business of the school system. The new members are attempting to learn the components of KERA and how they affect Floyd County. Anyone who attends the meetings will get a full appreciation of the many hours of reading and hard work that must be done by a board member. In Floyd County, everyone must work harder than normal and the board of education has been holding up their share of the

load.

Floyd County schools' policy making body—the board of education—appears to be well on its way to giving direction to an improved school system.

Instruction

For the past three years, the understanding and implementation of KERA has dominated the time of educators in Floyd County. Preparing for total new system of accountability, training in a new system of school management, (School Based Decision Making) preparing for a major infusion of technology, redesigning the early childhood delivery system (the primary program), and all of the other new programs of every single teacher and administrator in Floyd County. Some have worked harder than others, but we believe the work load has increased for every one.

The Central Office Reorganization affected instruction in that we attempted to better align the coordination of specific KERA strands with particular positions. We also employed a number of new people in instruction that will play a major role across the county in the implementation of KERA.

Specific new positions last year were the writing coordinator, technology coordinator and the vocational tech prep coordinator. The names of other positions were changed to reflect assignment differences. In short, we believe the new instructional arrangement will allow a stronger central office role in the technical assistance that is to be offered to schools.

In a few short weeks, Floyd County will receive the initial KIRIS testing results that will give us our first reading on the new accountability criteria. We have no idea how we will perform, we are anxious in that it will allow specific direction for improvement. We are optimistic that all schools will meet their thresholds, but we have no way of feeling confident that we will.

Instruction is moving or advancing at an acceptable pace. We still have some reluctant certified staff toward KERA, but every district has a certain number of staff that remain to be convinced that all the required change is for the good. We believe the number of reluctant staff grows smaller every day. Floyd County is equal to or farther along than the average district in Kentucky in the instructional component changes required from KERA, according to the opinion of the superintendent.

A tremendous number of personnel decisions have been made during the past year. A philosophy of involvement has been instituted with both positions at the school level and the central office. The superintendent ultimately is responsible, but the record will show that involvement in advisory groups has been instituted extensively in Floyd County.

Personnel is clearly an important responsibility in any school system and jobs in today's economy are difficult to find. That fact makes every facet of the employment process scrutinized and questioned more than ever. We hope to have been the process of employment in that the person who is most qualified will be the person who is employed for any and all positions in Floyd County.

Like any organization that employs over 1,000 people, the quality and attitude level was a great deal. But one thing is certain, Floyd County has many outstanding employees and we have tried to put the word out to do things as they should be done by law and tradition, work hard and be ready to defend any action if decisions that are made.

The major difference in attitude has improved and we want to work toward improving that image each day of the year. We want to be responsible, efficient and effective. When we are not and the problem can be specifically identified and documented, it will be addressed.

One major concern our attendance problem with students is real. But the attendance attitude of many, formerly of our employees, has been a concern. We have far too many employee absences. That must be improved and we intend to work on that as a serious problem.

Finance

The Floyd County School ended 1992-93 with a fund balance of slightly over one million dollars. We must maintain that balance and the coming year will be a challenge for everyone in the light of the fact that we may receive a significant reduction in state funds during the next few months.

We have a better handle on the different data bases due to the extensive work done by our new director of finance.

The budget process will begin in the fall of 1993 in order to make the best decisions in the spring of 1994

for budget year 1994-95. We must begin thinking about the budget on a year round basis as an on going process.

The frustrations with the past year and upcoming year is a result of state budget constraints. After new money flowed in 1990-91 and 1991-92, we have essentially been on a level pace with no new money. Some of the KERA strands have not been fully funded and salary raises have been almost non-existent over the past year and will be the case for the coming school year. Essentially, all the new money from two bienniums (four years) flowed to the district in the first two years. The new funds have been put to additional staff and many new programs—but we must be careful in the coming year because of the tightness of the budget.

Floyd County is not yet on a level playing field in terms of money per student, but we have come a long way toward equity in the past three years.

The school based budgeting process has been instituted for next year with Floyd County going far beyond the state requirements in allowing different decisions to be made at the school level. Our system believes that true school based decision making involves significant budget decisions to be made by school councils and school committees.

During the past year, significant attention has been focused on facilities and finances in Floyd County. We have attempted to better organize our work order procedure and other aspects of building cleanliness and maintenance. With a new organization headed by a chief of operations, the delivery of services to our schools in the areas of food service, transportation, facility repair, and financial accountability will continue to be a focus of our efforts.

Facility Construction
During the past twelve months, a significant planning process was undertaken by a group of 16 people to set the course for the next ten years for school facilities in Floyd County.

A plan will soon be approved by the Kentucky Department of Education and State Board of Education that will guide our efforts for the next decade. While that plan was put together with much effort and thought, changing situations in Floyd County can be dealt with through modifications to the plan if necessary.

The only significant progress in construction took place at South Floyd in that we will have completed the academic portion in phases I & II to be occupied on August 23, 1993. Phase III, the gymnasium, should have been under construction several months ago, but we hope to let bids in August and begin construction in September.

The Betsy Layne project is at a stand still until decisions are made on how to proceed in that area of the county.

The Adams addition of six classrooms and a technology lab should be let for bids in August.

Planning has begun on a new elementary school between Martin and Maytown and the renovation and addition at Prestonsburg High School. State board approval of the new plan is necessary to proceed.

The four new facilities in Floyd County at Adams, Duff, Allen and South Floyd are tremendous new schools. Floyd County was behind and still has a great deal of catching up to do in facility improvements. In the coming year we will continue to try and get three new projects underway—Betsy Layne, Martin/Maytown and Prestonsburg High. To have seven new facilities out of twenty schools is a significant accomplishment in a five year period of time. The work to keep the other 13 buildings operating efficiently will be ongoing and a challenge.

Summary
This State of the School System commentary could have covered many other areas, but the report would be too lengthy. Suffice it to say that Floyd County is truly a system in transition. Things are not the way they used to be and will never be the

way they used to be in virtually every aspect of the school system. We are working to become a "system of schools"—each with an independent and unique operational plan. We want twenty successful schools in Floyd County and we have a good start on that goal.

New health services coming to area

An Indiana diagnostic health care service plans to expand its services into Floyd County.

Precision Medical Diagnostic Services of Evansville, Indiana has proposed to expand its existing mobile X-ray, EKG and Holter (long-term EKG), monitoring services to 34 Kentucky counties, including Floyd, Johnson, Magoffin, Martin and Pike counties.

The services will be offered to nursing homes, personal care homes, home health agencies, correctional facilities, and private corporations.

No capital expenditure is involved. The Interim Office of Health Planning and Certification is considering the health care proposal under a nonsubstantive review. Nonsubstantive review expedites the formal review process required for a certificate of need; such review can be granted in certain cases as specified by statute and regulation.

Persons affected by the proposed change under review may request a public hearing on the application. Requests must be submitted in writing by July 29 to Richard Carroll, Chief Hearing Officer, Interim Office of Health Planning and Certification, 275 E. Main St., Frankfort, KY 40621.

The interim office plans to complete its review by August 23.

opens for Opry Monday

Twenty years ago George Younce and Glen Payne sang with Roy Tremble and George Webster as The Cathedral Quartet. Younce and Payne are still singing with The Cathedral, but Tremble and Webster removed themselves from the quartet more than 10 years ago.

They've kicked around in Gospel Music ever since, but are now back and serious about the business. With Chuck Crain and Brent Frederick, they've formed a new male Quartet called Heartland—and they've come to sing.

"Good singing will be there when all the gimmicks are gone," said Eldridge Fox after helping the guys cut a record on the Pinnacle label at Horizon Music Group in Asheville, North Carolina, "and these boys are good singers. To me, this is Southern Gospel at its best."

Wait till you hear the tape, and you'll likely agree. The album is called "Makin' Gold," and some of the songs are "Testing Time," "Telegram From Heaven," "No Further Than Your Knees" and "Little Is Much."

Heartland is a harmony group. They can do low, middle or high harmony, depending on what they think the song calls for, and they do it well.

Until last Easter all four were singing with The Blackwood Quartet. Larry Thompson, who owns Thompson Trucking in Pikeville, heard them and immediately liked their pure harmony. He told them, "If you're ever looking for an opportunity, call me."

When they left The Blackwood group last Easter, they contacted Thompson, and true to his word he put them on the road as The Heartland Quartet out of Branson, Missouri, which is rapidly becoming one of the entertainment centers of the country.

With Tremble as first tenor, Crain

singing lead, Webster baritone and playing piano, and Frederick laying a solid bass foundation. Heartland has had a busy summer, singing all over the country and cutting two or three tapes and one video without benefit of a label.

But Horizon Music Group took them on recently and put them on a label tape very quickly.

Frederick is a relative newcomer to Gospel Music. A basso profundo like Arnold Hyles used to be with The Rangers Quartet. Frederick had a part-time country group in eastern Kansas, but his voice had an excellent low quality that lent itself more to Gospel.

Crain sang with Wendy Johnson and The Messengers in the early 1970s when he was in the

Navy. After his discharge he sang a while with local groups in Florida and with The Mid-South Boys in the middle 70s. He also logged nine years singing with his wife and sister-in-law.

The Gospel singing careers of George and Roy

go back before their stint with The Cathedral. George was singing with a group called The Templeaires at first, and in 1961 they won the National Quartet Convention's talent contest in Memphis.

Roy attended the Stamps-Baxter School of Music in 1965 and James Blackwood heard him sing and recommended him to The Lancers Trio, an offshoot of The Junior Blackwood Brothers. After a stint with The Lancers he moved to The Weatherford Quartet for a few years, and then in 1971 began singing first tenor with The Cathedral.

A year later, George came to The Cathedral, and he and Roy were with George and Glen for nine years, singing for Rex Hubbard in his Cathedral of Tomorrow in Akron, Ohio.

"We've been in Gospel Music all our lives, it seems," George said. "I thought we were on the shelf when we left Ron, but God brought us together again."

"We felt there was a niche for us," he said. "Most groups coming into Gospel singing are mixed groups, and we felt there was a void in the male Quartet business. We're going to do what we can to help fill that void. We'll sing some of the old stuff—folks will know the songs we sing."

This is a Quartet with experience, loaded with talent, and eager to sing.

NEWS OF THE WEIRD

In January, a Denver General Hospital clinic began a program to attract reluctant inner-city pregnant women to get prenatal care by offering them free lottery tickets. And in May, a fee-charging family planning clinic in Wilmington, Del., began offering abortions at a 25 percent discount to women under age 18.

In February, New York Supreme Court Justice Richard Rudegeord ordered Manhattan homeless man Larry Hogue released from a state mental hospital, saying he was not mentally ill but rather had only an "attitude problem." According to New York Attorney General Robert Abrams, Hogue is incoherent, spends his government disability checks on crack cocaine, menaces pedestrians, assaults some of them (especially the elderly), sets fire to cars, exposes his genitals, and throws objects such as park benches through plate-glass windows.

In May, a Pennsylvania appeals panel ruled that a student in Hempfield, Pa., expelled for selling marijuana in the school hallway, should be reinstated because he has a "learning disability" that somehow impeded his judgment.

In December, Clemens Bontrager was jailed for six days in Sparta, Wis., for refusing to purchase a state sanitary-code permit for his outhouse, claiming that the permit system was an improper government dominance over his Amish life. (In other parts of Wisconsin, many Amish willingly purchase the permits.)

Washington (D.C.) City Paper reported in January that police officers candidates in that city are not

disqualified either for any criminal behavior engaged in as juveniles or for as many as six instances of drug use as adults. The head of the local police officers' union said a reform school inmate could walk right in the police academy's front door and be in the running for a job.

BAD TIMES FOR GOOD SAMARITANS

When Lorne Murdoch stopped along the road to aid victims of a car-truck collision in Los Angeles in May, someone stole his car. And Gary and Lisa Koffsky were off for Atlantic City following their wedding in June when they stopped their car to help a driver slumped over the wheel in the center of a parkway in North Massapequa, N.Y., and as they waited for help, another car hit them, sending them to the hospital for their honeymoon.

Last summer, Greg Morris, 38, of Tulsa, Okla., threatened lawsuits against several New Mexico state agencies because they failed to rescue him and his family soon enough after his plane crashed around 7:30 a.m. in the desert. The plane crashed around 8 p.m.; a volunteer-only search operation began around 9 p.m., and the crash site was discovered at 6:32 the next morning. Said the Taos town manager, "I've had a lot of volunteer citizens who gave of their own time without any compensation to help them find that airplane crash, and later to provide the victims with emergency first aid and rescue."

In December, Dorothy Prichard of New Haven, Conn., auto mechanic Doug Lopes for negligence in "repairing" her car. Lopes had

stopped to help her on Interstate 95 on a Sunday evening. He trimmed the radiator hose on the overheating car and topped off the radiator with spring water he had in his car. Prichard claimed that, 60 miles later, the hose came loose again and so sued Lopes for the hose, engine damage, the anguish of sitting with a broken-down car, and scratches in the paint job caused by Lopes.

THE WEIRDO-AMERICAN COMMUNITY

David Michael Russell was arrested in June in a tunnel-like attic above the Village Glen Plaza shopping center in Thousand Oaks, Calif., where he had been living for the last three years. Inside his "home," which was accessible only through a crawl space, police found rugs, bookshelves and books, a desk, a TV, a microwave oven and a stereo system.

LEAST COMPETENT PEOPLE USA Today reported in March that the West Virginia legislature was receiving calls from fishermen protesting the legislature's proposed law against people "stalking" other people. The fishermen said they had heard the legislature was proposing to ban "stocking," as in the stocking of streams with fish.

In May, a spokesperson for the district attorney's office in Newton, Mass., said prosecutors were "leaning toward suicide" as the cause of death of a 52-year-old man found

floating in the Charles River. The body was found tied with rope at the wrist and with electrical tape over the mouth.

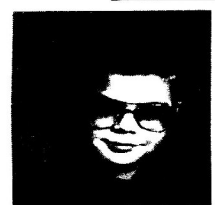
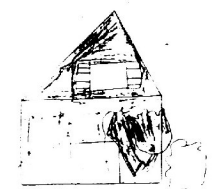
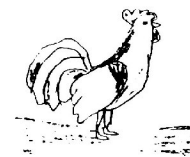

Ashleigh Greene, Amy Tackett and Jayne Hale brought in the first three positions for the Waves. Greene placed first, Tackett second and Hale third.

A strong finish by Magoffin County in the boys 16 and under butterfly closed the margin to 38 points at 248-210.

It was all Jenny Wiley from then on as they swam out to a 285-248 lead on a disqualification against Magoffin County.

The Waves won the boys' 16 and under medley relay to finish the meet.

The Waves are coached by Rhonda Clark, who says the team has been hit with some problems this year because of other activities.

"We had 67 sign up for the swim team this year," she stated, "and I have never had all of them at the same meet all summer."

"We've had swimmers out because of basketball camps, baseball, cheerleader camps and other things," she continued. "Andy Jarvis, I don't know how he is living. He is into everything. Bible schools have taken our swimmers, but that's alright."

The strong part of the Waves team is the good, strong young swimmers that come into the program every year. According to Clark, the younger ones have yet to be a disappointment.

"They (9-10-year-olds) haven't lost in two years," she said. "We always come in first, second or third. Ashley (Greene), Amy (Tackett) and Jayne (Hale) are three of the top swimmers we have."

Clark said that the Waves have been very competitive against the local team they have swam against.

"We went to Barrenville and only lost by 30 points," said a pleased Clark. "There, we swam against swimmers that swim year round. We swim for two months out of a year and I feel we are very competitive for just a short season."

Clark advocates starting a year-round program in Floyd County and feels that the Allen Central High School pool would be ideal.

Clark approached school officials on the status of the pool.

"Dr. (Stephen) Towler told me that they were going to fix it or fill it," said Clark. "If they try and fill it they will have to do like they do Granny Clamette and carry me out in a rocking chair. I will camp out in the pool."

ball over the left field fence.

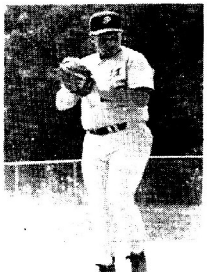
Clark surrendered a run in the top of the second when South Laurel took a 2-1 lead but the run was unearned as Brent Adams' throw from centerfield went astray.

DON'T FOLLOW THE RULES FOR TOPWATER FISHING

Summer ranks as one of the most productive times to fish topwater lures for bass, but if you do try it, don't follow the rules.

That's the advice of Johnson Outboards Pro Staff angler and former bass fishing world champion Guido Hibdon, who frequently catches big bass by fishing surface lures when conditions are considered less than ideal.

"Most bass fishermen use topwater lures on cloudy days when the wind puts a ripple on the water," says Hibdon, "but I have caught huge fish on bright, calm days when there wasn't a cloud in the sky."

"I love to fish topwater lures, and I believe you can use them year-round. The summer months, of course, are excellent times to use them, but you can catch bass on topwater lures in some places in the winter, too."

Hibdon, winner of the 1988 Bass Masters Classic, has made a career of going against established traditions in his choices of when and where to fish certain types of tackle. He is famous for fishing extremely light lures in heavy cover and for using tiny lures to catch big bass.

"If you use a topwater lure only on cloudy days, or only early in the morning, then you're using what everyone else is using at the same time," says the Johnson pro. "I want to show the bass something different because I think fish can become conditioned to seeing the same lures over and over."

"I'll fish topwater lures all day long, and I normally use only the larger ones, too," Hibdon continues. "I believe larger, more noisy topwater lures attract bigger bass, and when those fish do come out to look at a big lure, they're coming out to eat it, not just try to scare it away."

Hibdon does not have any specific techniques for using topwater lures,

although he admits a preference for fishing them around flooded timber and over submerged grass.

"Topwater lures are excellent lure choices for fishing around cover," he says, "but don't limit yourself to shallow water the way so many fishermen do. On clear lakes, a big noisy topwater lure will often draw bass up from deep points and rocky bluffs."

Hibdon also lets the bass tell him which retrieve to use. Normally, a slow but noisy retrieve works well, but at times bass want a fast moving lure or one that stops and starts erratically.

"It takes about two bass to tell me which retrieve to use," he explains. "Until I catch those fish, I vary my retrieve on each cast. Sometimes, bass can really be particular about how they want a lure presented."

"The main thing to remember about topwater lures," he concludes, "is to fish them whenever you want to. I'm convinced bass will hit them all day long, and at all seasons of the year."

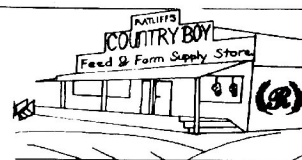
